LANE REDUCTIONS FOR THE 9/11 REMEMBRANCE MEMORIAL

The City of Lansing Department of Planning & Neighborhood Development announces the following lane restrictions will be in effect beginning around **8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 11, 2007**. These restrictions are to accommodate the **City of Lansing and surrounding area Fire, Police and EMS with their 9/11 Remembrance Memorial** that is scheduled to take place **between 9:45 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. at Wentworth Park**.

The following streets will have lane restrictions prior to the event beginning around 8:00 a.m.
Westbound Michigan Avenue between Museum Drive and Grand Avenue;
Allegan Street between Grand Avenue and Washington Square;
Grand Avenue between Allegan Street and Ionia Street;

Please Note: The western most northbound travel lane on Grand Avenue at the intersection of Michigan Avenue will be restricted to **THRU TRAFIC ONLY**, while the eastern most northbound travel lane on Grand Avenue at the intersection of Michigan Avenue will be required to **TURN RIGHT ONLY**.

A memorial procession is scheduled to step off at 9:45 a.m. from Washington Square and will march to Wentworth Park traveling east on Michigan Avenue to Wentworth Park, when this procession reaches Grand Avenue, Lansing Police will temporarily stop traffic while the procession crosses Grand Avenue to Wentworth Park.

Access to local area businesses, adjacent to actual event area, will be maintained during this event. Drivers are advised to seek alternate routes to minimize delays.
