MAIN STREET, MARTIN L. KING JR. BOULEVARD, ST. JOSEPH STREET LANE REDUCTIONS

The City of Lansing Department of Planning and Neighborhood Development announces that the Michigan Department of Transportation will begin pavement restoration work on the two outside lanes of Northbound and Southbound Martin L. King Jr. Boulevard (ML King) from the intersection of Olds Avenue to 70 feet north of Ottawa Street on Friday September 15, 2006. Construction is anticipated to be completed by September 24, 2006. One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction at all times.

Main Street will be closed between Northbound and Southbound ML King for concrete removal and replacement beginning Monday September 25, 2006 and anticipated to be completed by October 1, 2006. The detour route for Main Street traffic is southbound ML King to northbound ML King to Main Street. Main Street will be re-opened to traffic beginning Monday October 2, 2006 with single lane closures remaining for approximately one week.

Pavement restoration work on the inside lane and auxiliary lanes on Northbound and Southbound ML King from the intersection of Olds Avenue to 70 feet north of Ottawa Street will begin Tuesday September 26, 2006 and anticipated to be completed by Friday September 29, 2006. One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction at all times.

Milling and resurfacing of Main Street from 450 feet west of ML King to 575 feet east of ML King, and St. Joseph Street from 465 feet west of ML King to 640 feet east of ML King will begin on Saturday September 30, 2006 and anticipated to be completed by Sunday October 1, 2006. One lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction at all times.

Please note that all scheduled work is weather dependant and is subject to change.

Please be advised: public transportation may adjust their travel patterns during construction. Please contact CATA to determine if their route has changed.

Access to all local businesses adjacent to the work zone will be maintained at all times. Motorists are advised to expect delays.

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
